This Anti-bullying Policy has been developed to highlight our zero-tolerance approach to bullying at Duncanrig Secondary School.

Our aim is to maintain a respectful, equitable and inclusive culture and ethos.

This policy will promote consistency in prevention, reporting and actioning bullying incidents.

If you are being bullied or you witness a bullying incident you should follow the procedures below:

- Report online abuse to an adult and/or the website providers, unfriend or block abusers if necessary
- "See it, report it": report any incidents of concern to your pupil support teacher
- Work in partnership with staff, parents and relevant others to create a plan of support



When an incident of bullying is reported the following procedures should be followed.

A Member of Staff will:

- Reassure the reporter that the incident will be investigated
- Report to a Pupil Support Teacher
- Fill in the Bullying Incident Report Form

A Pupil Support Teacher will:

- Investigate all allegations
- Use restorative practices to reach positive resolutions
- Provide support to pupils affected as well as pupils who are displaying bullying behaviours
- Liaise with parents/carers
- Record the bullying incident
- Continue to monitor incidents

SLT will:

- Take appropriate action
- 2. Liaise with parents/carers and local authority
- Maintaining appropriate records in SEEMiS
- Undertake ongoing reflection and evaluation of school procedures to address bullying behaviour
